

Nuevo horario de los primeros sábados:

Dos cambios están llegando a nuestro horario litúrgico para el Primer Sábado del mes. El sábado es un día tradicionalmente dedicado a la Santísima Virgen María. Si bien la mayoría de las parroquias tienen una misa matutina los sábados que generalmente se celebra en honor a María, no es factible para nuestro horario aquí. Sin embargo, me gustaría añadir más oportunidades de devoción a Nuestra Santísima Madre. A partir de este próximo sábado 1 de mayo, todos los primeros sábados celebraremos la oración matutina desde el Memorial sabaario de la Santísima Virgen a las 9:00 a.m., seguido por el Rosario.

En el pasado, la práctica aquí los primeros sábados había sido exponer el Santísimo Sacramento después de la misa española, y observar la adoración nocturna hasta el domingo por la mañana justo antes de la misa. Si bien la adoración nocturna es una práctica loable, es logísticamente dificil asegurar que todas las horas serán cubiertas, y se había convertido en sólo un par de familias que permanecen toda la noche. Por lo tanto, en el futuro, reservaremos la adoración nocturna para algunas ocasiones especiales durante todo el año. El primer sábado de cada mes, la adoración tendrá lugar como lo hacía todos los sábados durante la Cuaresma de este año, con exposición al final de la misa inglesa, y adoración hasta la celebración de vísperas antes de la misa española. Durante este período de adoración, se ofrecerán confesiones.

From Fr. Corv:

New First Saturday Schedule:

Two changes are coming to our liturgical schedule for the First Saturday of the month. Saturday is a day traditionally devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary. While most parishes have a morning Mass on Saturdays which is usually celebrated in honor of Mary, it is not feasible for our schedule here. However, I would like to add more opportunities for devotion to Our Blessed Mother. Beginning this coming Saturday, 1 May, every First Saturday we will celebrate Morning Prayer from the Saturday Memorial of the Blessed Virgin at 9:00 AM, followed by the Rosary.

In the past, the practice here on First Saturdays had been to expose the Blessed Sacrament following Spanish Mass, and to observe nocturnal adoration until Sunday morning just before Mass. While nocturnal adoration is a laudable practice, it is logistically difficult to ensure that all the hours will be covered, and it had devolved into just a couple of families remaining all night. Therefore, going forward, we will reserve nocturnal adoration for a few special occasions throughout the year. On the First Saturday of each month, adoration will take place as it did every Saturday during Lent this year, with exposition occurring at the end of the English Mass, and adoration running until the celebration of Vespers before Spanish Mass. During this period of adoration, confessions will be offered.

May Crowning for Mary

May is Mary's month! And during May, throughout the Catholic world, special devotions honor the Virgin Mary. "May Crowning" is a traditional Catholic ritual that occurs in the month of May and it recognizes Mary as Queen of heaven and earth. May Crowning will take place on the weekend of May 8-9.

Adult Faith Formation:

A new adult faith formation series begins on Thursday, 6 May. Following from the results of the survey we sent out a few months ago, I will be offering a series on The History of the Sacred Liturgy as found in the documents of the Church. This will be a ten (possibly twelve) part series, starting with Sacred Scripture and the ancient Church, moving through the Patristic age and into the Middle Ages, then taking in the Council of Trent and the Counter-Reformation, and into the modern period. The documents presented will be provided ahead of time.

The schedule will be as during Lent, with adoration from 4:45-5:45, concluding with Vespers, and then the talk at 6:00 pm. Talks will be livestreamed on YouTube to enable at-home participation; we will take questions from those at home via the live chat function.

The plan going forward for adult faith formation is to have a short-form series during Advent and Lent (three weeks during Advent, and six during Lent), and then longer form series in the summer and fall, of ten to twelve weeks apiece.
