- The framing of *Saint Francis of Assisi Painting* was completed this past Thursday.

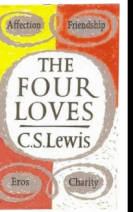

Father Cory's Lecture Series

The Gospel of Names:

On the Peculiar Emphases of the Gospel of Luke



Throughout history, scholars have given the Gospel of St. Luke a number of different names or labels, highlighting the unique emphases of this proclamation of the life of Jesus Christ. While the Third Gospel is commonly grouped alongside those of Mark and Matthew as a "synoptic Gos-

pel," meaning they follow roughly the same timeline in outlining the story, several threads run through Luke's presentation which cause it to stand alone in many respects. Join us for an exploration of the many names by which Luke's Gospel has come to be known and the reasons for his emphases on those subjects. Sessions will be held on Tuesdays beginning January 25th. Lauds will be at 9:00am with the Lecture following at 9:30am in the Fellowship Hall.

Stewardship: it is described as the sharing of one's Time, Talent and Treasure for the greater glory of God. While it is true that an increase in monetary Treasure is not a bad thing, it should be thought of that the Treasure could be the gift of oneself. One's Time and Talent is sometimes all one has and therefore is their Treasure, and the sharing of that is their gift to God. This sharing is also known as **volunteering opportunities**.
